The Foundation is pleased to announce that the Government of Alberta has selected JMAA architecture from Red Deer as the architect for the project. The initial design work will begin shortly and we are looking forward to developing the vision and shape of this project in Innisfail with government.

“Seniors built this province and they deserve to retire in dignity. That’s why our government is making life better for seniors by investing in projects like the new lodge in Innisfail,” said Lori Sigurdson, Minister of Seniors and Housing. “Parkland Foundation is making great progress on this important lodge which will provide safe and affordable housing for seniors—I look forward to its completion.”

While the new lodge is constructed, residents will remain in the existing Autumn Glen Lodge. All efforts to minimize disruption to residents and visitors will be taken while construction takes place.

Construction of the new lodge and additional independent living facilities are managed by the Government of Alberta. The Board of Directors has been working closely with government to move the project along.

“We are excited to see the beginning of the new lodge and seniors' independent living building taking shape. We are working closely with government on this project and will keep our community involved in its progress,” said Connie Huelsman, Board Chair.
